Equally respected for her programming, she is founding Artistic Director of New Paths Music, and was Co-Artistic Director with Martin Roscoe of the Beverley Chamber Music Festival 2018-2022. Libby's recent/forthcoming calendar includes concerts at Wigmore Hall, Oxford Lieder, Leeds Lieder and Aldeburgh Festivals; The Rite of Spring with Chris Hopkins; the complete Beethoven cello sonatas with five different cellists; and broadcasts with the BBC Singers. Her premiere with Marcus Farnsworth of Cheryl Frances-Hoad's Everything Grows Extravagantly was selected as a Times highlight of the year. Currently undertaking a nationwide Bach marathon, 'Project 48', Libby is performing the whole of Bach's Well-Tempered Clavier ('The 48') in every one of England's 48 counties, to date raising over £30,000 for Help Musicians, Live Music Now, Future Talent and Youth Music.
